



Criteria for Achieving Master Watchmaker Status

1. Mentored by a master watchmaker for at least 3 years after obtaining appropriate qualifications.
2. Professional member of the Master Clock and Watch Makers Association of WA Inc. for at least 3 consecutive years.
3. Graduate of the Watch & Clock School of WA or equivalent trade qualification.
4. Proven ability in at least one of the following areas:
 - manufacture/repair a timepiece that the mentor has not undertaken
 - create a custom made tool in order to manufacture/repair parts
 - contribute to the horology industry in WA. For example: through providing education to others in the trade; writing and publishing a book relevant to the horological industry; publishing several articles in reputable horological journals around the world
 - utilising existing hi tech machinery to manufacture parts. For example, CNC machine; wire EDM machine.
5. Give a presentation to Master Clock and Watch Makers of WA Inc. members as evidence of the above.
6. Submit the *Application for Master Watchmaker Status* form to watch.clockschooll@gmail.com

- will have attained Master status
- will be given a certificate
- can mentor other watchmakers
